### Impressions of the Alhambra

In 1829, the great American writer Washington Irving went to Spain. He documented his journey, his stay at the Alhambra, and the legends of that magnificent Moorish palace in Granada in the best-seller,

Tales of The Alhambra. Enhanced by an





abundance of projections, Irving's words and exquisite use of language come to life in *Impressions of the Alhambra*. Be transported through spoken word, movement, and styles of Middle Eastern, *escuela bolera*, and Baroque dance, to a distant place — a "haunted ground." (Cast of ten.)

### Through Her Eyes

Celebrate women's contributions to world culture in this relevant and meaningful multimedia experience, perfect for Women's History Month. Meet two historical women of the Ancient Middle East — Enheduanna, the poet/priestess of Mesopotamia, and Hatshepsut, the female Pharaoh/King of Ancient Egypt. Enter into the world "beyond the
